INTRODUCTION

- Breastfeeding is nourishing a baby with breast milk, either directly from the breast or pumped and given in a bottle ¹.
- It is beneficial for both, mother, child and the bond created between the two of them².
- The WHO advises breastfeeding exclusively for the first 6 months, then introducing complementary foods while continuing breastfeeding for at least 2 years ³.
- Nursing education and support is essential to establish this process ⁴.

RESULTS

Four nursing interventions were found helpful for families to establish lactation.

Professional counselling

Breastfeeding education, counselling, long-term support and psychosocial support led by a nurse or midwife aimed at mothers and their couples ⁵.



CONCLUSION

- The majority of women find breastfeeding difficult at some point. Education and support provided by professionals and women who have had a similar experience are essential.
- Not only is education important, but also nurses' capacity of encouraging mothers' confidence and mental health support.
- Highlighting mothers' participation as well as couples' or other relatives inclusion in the process is key.
- *Implications*: involving partners and grandparents, comprehensive training for nurses and midwives and the implementation of supportive hospital policies and measurement scales to ensure effective care delivery.
